May	Ch 3-4. Addition and subtraction (4-digit). Estimation. Word problems.
July	Ch 5-6. Multiplication (tables up to 15, 2-digit by 1-digit). Properties.
August	Ch 7-8. Multiplication of 3-digit by 1-digit. Half-yearly revision.
September	Half-yearly Examination.
October	Ch 9-10. Division by 1-digit. Long division intro. Word problems.
November	Ch 11-12. Fractions (proper, equivalent). Geometry - lines, angles (basic), 2D-3D shapes.
December	Ch 13. Measurement (length, weight, capacity, conversions). Perimeter.
January	Final chapters. Money (profit/loss basic). Time (24-hour, duration). Data handling.
February	Full revision. Sample papers, problem-solving.
March	Annual Examination.

Science

Class 4 Science - plants, animals, human body systems, water, air, matter, energy, space.

Month	Topics / Chapters
April	Plants: Parts (detailed), photosynthesis (basic), types. Seeds, flowers.
May	Animals: Classification, adaptation, food chain, life cycles.
July	Human Body: Digestive system, respiratory system, skeletal system.
August	Food and Nutrition: Nutrients, deficiency diseases. Half-yearly revision.
September	Half-yearly Examination.
October	Water: Sources, water cycle, conservation, water-borne diseases.
November	Air: Composition, importance, wind, air pollution.
December	Matter and Materials: States of matter, changes, properties.
January	Force, Work, Energy: Push, pull, gravity, forms of energy, simple machines.
February	Earth and Space: Solar system, planets, seasons, eclipse. Full revision.
March	Annual Examination.

Social Science

SST covers Earth, India geography, history (ancient to modern), government.

Month	Topics / Chapters
April	Our Earth: Shape, globe vs map. Continents and oceans. Latitudes and longitudes (basic).
May	India - Physical Features: Location, mountains, rivers, plateaus, deserts, plains.
July	Climate of India: Seasons, monsoons. States of India: Map work, capitals.
August	Indian Civilization (basic): Indus Valley, Vedic period. Half-yearly revision.
September	Half-yearly Examination.
October	Great Empires of India: Mauryas, Guptas. Famous kings - Ashoka, Chandragupta.
November	Medieval India: Delhi Sultanate, Mughals. Famous Mughals - Akbar, Shah Jahan.
December	British Rule and Freedom Struggle: British arrival, freedom fighters, 1947 Independence.
January	Our Government: Democracy, three levels. Indian Constitution (basic).
February	Our Environment: Natural and man-made. Conservation. Full revision.
March	Annual Examination.

GK at Class 4 covers India, world, history, sports, science in more depth.

Month	Topics / Chapters
April	Solar system in detail. Continents, oceans facts.
May	India - states, capitals, languages, dances. Rivers, mountains, lakes.
July	World - countries, capitals, currencies. Famous landmarks.
August	Indian history - kings, dynasties. Half-yearly revision.
September	Half-yearly Examination.
October	Famous personalities - Indian and world (scientists, leaders, sportspersons).
November	Sports - games, players, achievements. Olympics, Asian Games.
December	Inventions, technology. Famous scientists.
January	Current affairs. Indian government.
February	Environment, wildlife, national parks. Full revision.
March	Annual Examination.

Important Notes for Parents & Teachers

- **Daily study routine:** A Class 4 child needs about 1.5 to 2 hours of focused study after school, ideally split into short blocks with breaks.
- **Reading habit:** Daily independent reading in both English and Hindi improves comprehension and writing dramatically.
- **Math practice:** Regular practice of current topic and mental maths is essential.
- **Continuous assessment:** The school follows continuous evaluation - classwork, projects, oral and written tests all matter, not just final exams.
- **Parent involvement:** Regular communication with class teacher and reviewing homework helps the child stay on track.
